At *Family Retreat*, it's a solemn moment when the leaders pray over each pair of hands that'll serve during the week. And each of us needs the prayer! It's as A.W. Tozer said, "We go astray when we attempt to do spiritual work without spiritual power."

Our Family Retreat season is behind us now, so join me in praying that the thousands of Gospel seeds that were sown will bear much fruit for the kingdom of Christ. Hope and Joy


ope is 32 years old and has Angelman syndrome. She had her first seizure when she was just two years old, and doctors gave her parents a bleak diagnosis:

"Family Retreat is respite for people who are gasping for air," says Greg. "Here, people understand our situation. For Hope and me, it's a week where we get to love on one another."

ohn received a traumatic brain injury (TBI) when he was only three months old. Now nine years old, John lives with attention deficit disorder in addition to his TBI.

"It's definitely not easy to get a break," says his mom, Emily. "Finding someone we can trust who can put up with the behaviors caused by John's disability is very difficult."

Glen, John's dad, agrees. "We only get about three hours of rest each night. The sleep deprivation is overwhelming." There's no doubt that Glen and Emily need rest and rejuvenation, and that's where *Halftime Respite* comes in!

"Halftime Respite makes us all feel safe and accepted," says Emily. "It's very comforting knowing we have a place where John can come and play with other children with special needs. At Halftime Respite, John gets to be John."

"At Joni and Friends, people with disabilities are celebrated for who they are," says Glen. And what do John's parents do while he's having a blast with his *Halftime Respite* buddies?

"We go out on a date," says Emily with a big smile. "We have dinner and go for a walk and have time together that we don't get otherwise. Joni and Friends showers us all with love and attention."




at International Family Retreat

When Aaron and Sarah attended our *Marriage Getaway*, they shared that while their marriage is strong, their blended family of nine children—four living with disability—strains their relationship.

"One of us may have to quit our job just to stay home with the children, and this causes financial hardships and distress," says Sarah. One child with autism and others with developmental disabilities add physical safety concerns to their unique family dynamics. Violent behaviors are not uncommon.

"Aaron and I work hard to maintain balance in our home, but sometimes it can be overwhelming," shares Sarah. "The *Marriage Getaway* was a blessing to us. It helped us connect spiritually. A weight has been lifted off my shoulders!"

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.

She continues, "Both Aaron and I were diagnosed with disabilities as children, but disability does not define us. At *Marriage Getaway*, we found a community of couples who understand us. We are keeping Jesus first in our marriage—not disability."

"I remember the first night at Family Retreat when we were having dinner with other families. I was thinking, 'Wow, we aren't the only family dealing with this!' It was such a blessing to be around other families who got it," says Matt. "Once we were around other families like ours, we had an instant connection with them."

"Life is much harder having kids with special needs," says Matt. "They require a lot of our attention. It also limits what we can be involved in. There are certain places where we cannot go. Having kids with special needs can become very isolating if you are not intentional about getting out as a family. Many people do not understand how hard it is. We have very few people who are willing to watch our kids."

"We were dead... just dead," confesses Sarah, recalling that difficult season of their lives. "We exhausted ourselves and were empty."

One week at Family Retreat not only confirmed their calling—it provided an absolutely life-changing experience for the whole family, and soon enough Kevin and Sarah decided to adopt two more children with disabilities!

As their family of eight returned to Family Retreat year after year, Kevin and Sarah sensed God placing another call on their hearts—a desire to see God work in the hearts and minds of Family Retreat volunteers. "Mentoring volunteers allows us to be a safe place for them to ask questions and learn about disability."

Now seasoned volunteer coordinators, Sarah and Kevin are lifelong friends of Joni and Friends, looking forward to serving in whatever ways they can. They have mentored over 400 volunteers to date, including those at this summer's inaugural *Family Retreat* in Sacramento.

"Life can be hard, but people with disabilities matter, their families matter, and we have so much work to do to make sure that they are welcome at their church as loved members of the body of Christ," says Sarah.

Several of Kevin and Sarah's children now serve as *Family Retreat* volunteers themselves. Their whole family has been transformed because of their time at *Family Retreat*.

"Attending Family Retreat was a new beginning for us," says Sarah. "Serving together with Joni and Friends, using our life experiences raising children with disabilities, is our greatest joy."
