God always delights in displaying his power through weakness. And when people who live with affliction endure pain and poverty *yet* keep their hearts bright and their smiles fresh—their spiritual stability can only be explained by the miracle of God's sustaining grace.

Truly, this is great news for the weak and infirmed! Yet there are countless thousands of people like Jimly who have yet to hear this news about Jesus Christ and his saving message. Oh, my heart aches to reach them!

So this month, as we embark on our amazing 45th year of ministry, would you please help me get the salvation message of our Savior to families far and wide who struggle with disability? It doesn't get more glorious than helping a lost soul find his place in Christ. It's what God intended from the beginning of time.

That's 22 years on the floor, simply turning his his mother, Lillian, to carry for a very long time. The only way to transport him was on a stretcher. His entire body is twisted due not only to his cerebral palsy, but also from the absence of early medical assessment and intervention. Lillian lovingly places socks on Jimly's hands to prevent him from clawing at his face.

"This is one of the saddest things we see," explains Joni and Friends President, Laura Gardner, who served Jimly and his family. "Disability like this is so heartbreaking because it's preventable."

Laura's own parents served as missionaries in the Philippines. In fact, she lived in the Philippines for the first three years of her life before her parents moved their family back to the United States. "I never imagined that 52 years later, I would be serving families struggling with disabilities in the Philippines myself."

"If you can imagine," says Laura, "since birth, That's 22 years on the floor, simply turning his head back and forth to interact with his family. It breaks my heart to know that someone has lived like that day after day after day under those conditions for 22 years."

With tears in her eyes Laura continues, "I wanted to take away all of Jimly's pain and suffering, but I knew that we had given him the best gifts we could ever give—a custom-fitted wheelchair and the love and hope of Jesus Christ!"

After Jimly received his new wheelchair, our Wheels for the World team shared the Gospel with him and his mother. And Lillian accepted Jesus as her personal Savior! "Her whole countenance changed!" says Laura. "She went from a mom who was just frustrated and weary and tired, to one who now has hope! Lillian learned that the trials of life are only temporary. And now that she has accepted Christ, Lillian will get to be with our Heavenly Father for all eternity!"





"Jimly was so excited to get his new wheelchair! Once he was secure in his new seat of dignity and mobility, Lillian invited us to go visit their home," says Laura. "We arrived at their squatter village, and as Lillian welcomed us into their home, I noticed that the ceiling was not high enough for us to stand up. We all had to squat and bend over to get into their home."

"As trying as that was, we quickly learned that at least once a year the entire squatter village is flooded. It floods all the way to the roof," explains Laura. And yet Lillian's heart overflowed with gratitude.

"Thank you so much, Joni and Friends, for coming here!" said Lillian with a tear rolling down her cheek. "I never would have thought that today, Jimly would get a wheelchair and people would come to help my son. I will never get tired of saying, 'Thank you! Thank you, Lord!"

"What I learned that day is that no matter where you are in the world, a mother's love is the same," says Laura. "Lillian—a Filipino mom of a 22-year-old son with a disability—and me, an American mom of a 22-year-old son... We both want the same things for our boys—a Gospel-filled life with unwavering hope, unconditional love, and a sense of belonging."

Not long after she returned home to the States, Laura woke up to a text that contained shocking news. She explains, "Only 48 days after Lillian received Jesus as her Lord and Savior, she had a heart attack and went to heaven. That morning—sitting on the edge of my bed, staring at that text and praying through a steady stream of tears—I praised God for the privilege of knowing Lillian. I praised him for the treasured moments we shared as two moms of 22-year-old sons. Most importantly, I praised God for Lillian's salvation."

What if Wheels for the World had not gone to the Philippines? What if we never met Lillian? What if there was no Joni and Friends?



Karl and Sarah visited Thailand and fell in love with the Thai people. Bangkok became their home and they began planting new churches. Little did they know the life-changing experience coming their way that would lead them into disability ministry.

When they learned of their second pregnancy, Sarah and Karl were eager to welcome a baby brother for their daughter, Eden. At a routine 20-week ultrasound appointment, however, Sarah learned that their baby boy had myelomeningocele spina bifida, the most severe form of spina bifida.

Doctors painted a grim picture of what their son's life would be like—once their baby was born, he would need two surgeries. He probably would never walk, he would not be able to use the bathroom on his own, and he would most likely have cognitive and learning disabilities. Despite doctors' advice to terminate the pregnancy, Karl and Sarah trusted God for his good plans.

Medical consults and testing done in the United States allowed the option of a spinal closure surgery performed at 26 weeks in-utero. Karl and Sarah named their son Judah. "Judah means 'Praise the Lord!" they explain. "We continued to praise the Lord for Judah and for his future."

Judah required medical appointments and developmental evaluations that continued for nearly two years after his birth. His parents wondered if their missionary dreams had died—it seemed like everything they had prayed for and invested in had evaporated.

But then Karl and Sarah were invited to a *Family Retreat* for missionaries in Thailand. "I suddenly realized that God gave us Judah as part of our calling," says Karl. "People with disabilities are created in the image of God with value and worth. Churches need to welcome and include families with disability. Maybe that's what God is calling us to do in Thailand!"

At Family Retreat, Karl and Sarah's family met other missionaries, saw new opportunities, and sensed doors opening. "God showed us we are still called to missions and have important ministry work to do," says Sarah.

Karl, Sarah, and their beautiful children are now returning to Thailand as missionaries. "We praise God for our son," says Karl. "And we believe that through his life and his story, many people will come to praise the Lord, as well!"

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
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
