Our Beginnings

It was a hot July day when Joni Eareckson Tada took a fateful dive into shallow water in the Chesapeake Bay, breaking her neck on the bay's sandy bottom. Seventeen-year-old Joni did not know then how her resulting quadriplegia—and God's faithfulness in the midst of it—would become a testament to the power of the Gospel, upholding the dignity and worth of individuals living with disability worldwide.

The seeds for Joni's ministry were planted during her rehabilitation. Without use of her hands, she learned how to paint high-detail fine art by holding a brush in her mouth. She was interviewed on the Today Show because of her unique ability, which opened doors for her to share the Gospel through her life story. Her autobiography, *Joni: An Unforgettable Story*, was published in 1976 and has sold five million copies in 38 languages since. Billy Graham's production company produced her book into a feature length film, introducing the message of Jesus Christ's redeeming love to millions more.

People living with disability began to write to Joni for prayers and guidance, revealing a desperate need for Christian ministry in the disability community. Joni founded Joni and Friends in 1979 to answer those desperate calls for help.

Today, Joni and Friends has over 200 employees in over 20 locations across the United States. We operate locations and offer programming on six continents.

Why Disability?

God has always had a plan for the lives of people with disabilities. Yet all too often, people with disabilities and their families suffer from isolation, stigma, and poverty.

Anyone can have a disability, and disability can occur at any point in a person's life – especially as they age.

Individuals with disabilities face higher risk for premature death and chronic conditions. This isn't because of their disability, but because disparities in health care systems create barriers to care.

Sadly, barriers exist within the church, as well.

People with disabilities are less likely to attend church than their typical peers, as only 10% of U.S. churches offer any tangible support to people with disabilities.

One in three children with autism will never attend church.

Individuals on the autism spectrum experience loneliness and isolation at rates four times higher than their typical peers.

Less than 10% of the world's disabled are effectively reached with the Gospel.

Our Approach

Practical help is our platform for sharing the Gospel. All of our Christ-centered programs and services are designed to address the practical, spiritual, and social needs of individuals with disabilities as they are the image bearers of God who deserve equal treatment in our communities.

Joni and Friends is a loving and supportive resource for families living with disability, even if they just need an understanding and compassionate person to talk to.







The Need

Visibility: An estimated 1.3 billion people around the globe, or one in six human beings, live with significant disability.

Mobility: 80 million people worldwide need a wheelchair but in developing nations, less than 10% have access to one.

Access: Four out of every five disabled individuals living in low and middle-income countries have limited access to health services.

Well-being: People with disabilities have twice the risk of developing conditions such as depression, diabetes, and stroke.

Our Programs

Wheels for the World™ distributes both new and restored wheelchairs, along with a Bible, to people in need. The donated wheelchairs we collect are restored in volunteer work programs in correctional facilities.

Joni's House programs meet the needs of people living with disabilities through local support. In the U.S., Joni's House offers respite care to families. At international locations, Joni's House provides medical, economic, spiritual, and social support.

Family Retreat provides respite to families living with disability in a fully accessible camp environment where they are cared for, rejuvenated, and encouraged in Christ.

Warrior Getaway serves Veterans who have visible and invisible injuries as the result of military service. Each member of the Veteran's family is included in this unique retreat.

Marriage Getaway strengthens and refreshes the relationships of couples living with the disability of a spouse or child. We also offer **Single Parent Getaways**.

Church Trainings equip congregations to develop a culture that sees all people as indispensable parts of the body of Christ, created in God's image and worthy of dignity and respect.

Missions and Internships equip students for leadership in disability ministry through handson service as they provide care and advocate for all people living with disability.

The Christian Institute on Disability provides authoritative guidance on the biblical view of disability as well as Gospel-centered truth on issues pertaining to life, dignity, justice, and equality. It also offers online courses, certificate programs, and internships.

Joni and Friends also delivers daily inspirational media through radio and podcast programs including *Joni Eareckson Tada: Sharing Hope, A Moment with Joni,* and the *Joni and Friends Ministry Podcast.*
