hat are your first thoughts in the morning? Is your schedule so loaded that you're already on automatic before you get out of bed? Maybe pain or hardship makes you feel overwhelmed, like you can't even face the day.

If that's so, I want you—no, rather, God wants you—to move beyond merely resigning yourself to your schedule with a stiff upper lip or submitting to your hardships with a "woe is me" attitude.

Responses like these fall so far short of how God wants you to move into the day. Your hardships can provide a glorious pathway to genuine joy, contentment, and a more intimate friendship with Christ.

So, how do you get there? Well, after decades of living with quadriplegia, and almost half of that time living with chronic pain, I have learned to live on what God says. If he said it, I must live it! His Word must have its way in my life—and yours, too.

Heaven is a reservoir of strength, guidance, hope, and encouragement, but how do we appropriate all that? Well, Psalm 119:50 helps me. "My comfort in my suffering is this: Your promise preserves my life."

When life feels overwhelming, every blood-bought promise in God's Word can provide life, grace, energy, perspective, and strength. Every Bible promise gives the power to not only survive, but thrive in your afflictions. I mean, God pledges to you in Jeremiah 32:40–41, "I will never stop doing good to them, and I will inspire them to fear me, so that they will never turn away from me. I will rejoice in doing them good."

Oh, friend, start believing God and what he says! Jesus died to provide you the grace—that is, the Spirit-blessed ability—to actually live on his promises. When I am overcome by pain, I cling to Psalm 119:140... "Oh, God, your promises have been thoroughly tested, and your servant loves them." I love God's promises and choose one to live on each day.

When I feel weak I might choose 2 Chronicles 16:9, "For the eyes of the Lord range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him." Then, throughout the day, I know that God is working to strengthen me. Or, if I'm in physical pain, I could choose Psalm 34:19, "The righteous person may have many

troubles, but the Lord delivers him from them all." I take that promise and lift it before the Lord in prayer saying, "God, you promised to deliver me, to rescue me in my troubles today, so I'm bringing this promise before you in exchange for the blessing it guarantees."

I may have to breathe that prayer a few extra times that day to remind myself to look for the blessing, but when I do? God delivers me. He gives me courage to endure. He may raise my pain level tolerance for the day or help me miraculously persevere. And sometimes, he removes the pain. That is how biblical promises help me live. And when I live this way—every day, on a promise from God's Word—I have joy knowing that I'm pleasing the Lord.

So, tomorrow, wake up ready to rely on the promises of God, saying, "I can't do this hard thing in my life, but I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." That's Philippians 4:13 and, oh, what a powerful promise to start your day tomorrow morning... and the next day and the next. Be the one who thoroughly tests God's promises, and you will come to love them. *And that's a promise!*



Ripples of Cirace Around the World

I f you could visit eight-year-old Diana at the compound in Lusaka, Zambia where she lives, her bubbly personality would outshine the struggles she faces. Diagnosed with spina bifida, Diana's spine forms a noticeable hump on her back. She can't walk, but disability doesn't get in the way of Diana's joy—or her hope of becoming a doctor when she grows up.

While she has parents and siblings, it's Diana's beloved Aunt Doris, a retired social worker, who has cared for Diana full-time for the past five years. Not everyone in their community—or even family—understands that disability can be part of God's good plan.

Doris first encountered Joni Eareckson Tada decades ago when she read Joni's autobiography.

Moved by her story, Doris wondered if God was preparing her for life with a significant disability. Now, years later, she believes Joni's story was preparing her to love and raise Diana.

Beyond Joni's story, Doris has found deep comfort, wisdom, and purpose through the Joni and Friends *Beyond Suffering* curriculum. *Beyond Suffering* is rooted in the truth that all people, regardless of ability level, have equal dignity and value as God's image-bearers. Our Christ-centered curriculum has helped Doris educate those around her, making a way for Diana—and other children with disabilities in their community—to find belonging.

With the nurturing care Doris provides, Diana has flourished. She is full of creative



baking ideas, embraces her studies enthusiastically (she can speak three languages now!), and has an undeniable knack for making friends.

But with limited resources, Doris has struggled to meet Diana's needs—especially when she outgrew her toddler wheelchair, leaving her legs to drag dangerously on the ground.

When Doris learned that Joni and Friends was holding a *Wheels for the World*™ outreach in Zambia, she brought Diana—and our team instantly fell in love with Diana and her

cheerful laugh.

"Diana is somebody that just lights up the room when she enters," says our *Wheels for the World* volunteer, Kaylee. "She has a presence about her... She's full of joy."

As time went on, we learned more about the gentle, loving care from Doris that had helped to cultivate Diana's vibrant character. "Doris is super special," says Kaylee. "You can tell her love for Diana is pure. She loves Diana like her own child and pays close attention to her needs."

Chi Chi arrived in a makeshift wheelchair borrowed from her school. It was nothing more than a lawn chair with wheels affixed to it. She was quiet at first, but Chi Chi quickly opened up in Diana's warm company.

Like Diana, Chi Chi has high hopes for her future and loves school. And as they both waited for their custom-fitted wheelchairs, Diana and Chi Chi became inseparable. These fast friends both experienced powerful life changes because of Joni and Friends and because of your love!

While Diana and Chi Chi chatted and enjoyed blowing bubbles together, our *Wheels for the World* team selected and customized wheelchairs for each of the girls.

Chi Chi received a specialized pediatric wheelchair with a tray that will allow her to study and write easily. She also hopes to learn to play basketball now that she has a wheelchair of her own.

Along with their specialized wheelchairs, both Diana and Chi Chi also received Bibles and Gospel bracelets made of colored beads representing each part of God's salvation plan. The girls quickly learned the meaning of each bead and together they celebrated the love of Jesus in their lives.

Diana overflowed with excitement to share the Gospel message with others. Diana's passion sparked a powerful movement that day as she invited other children to hear the Gospel story. And, seeing her God-given gift for evangelism, our team prayed that Diana's wheelchair will help her reach new places to share the joy of Jesus with others.

saac is an active teenager who loves sports. His life—and his **_** goals for the future—took a dramatic turn after a somewhat minor soccer injury.

The routine and timely medical attention that others often take for granted never came for Isaac. Things are just different for his family in Zambia. And by the time they were able to get Isaac to the hospital—weeks after his initial injury—he had gangrene in both of his legs. There was no alternative: Isaac's legs had to be amputated.

When Isaac lost his legs, he thought his dream of being an athlete had been lost, too. But God resurrected Isaac's dreams when our Wheels for the World team custom-fit him with a specialized sports wheelchair. As soon as he was seated in his new wheelchair, Isaac started zipping all around our distribution site. And right then and there, Isaac declared his new goal: "to be a basketballer."



Isaac didn't just get a new wheelchair that day. He enthusiastically received the Gospel and a copy of Joni's autobiography. God gave Isaac new dreams and new hope in Christ!

"Don't Doubt that God Over You"

Everything changed when five-year-old Carlito stopped breathing.

It all started with Carlito getting sick and that illness turning into pneumonia. But nothing could prepare his parents, Carlos and Lucile, for their child's body reacting to routine pneumonia treatment with a heart attack. Carlito stopped breathing for ten agonizing minutes.

By God's grace, Carlito survived. But when he awoke, everything had changed. While deprived of oxygen, Carlito had suffered severe brain damage.

Over the next five years, the realities of disability hung heavily on his family. Carlito needed round-the-clock care seven days a week. His medication required 60 administrations each day, and every six months his tracheostomy tube had to be replaced.

Carlos and Lucile longed to buy a wheelchair for Carlito but could not afford one. When they learned that our *Wheels for the World™* team was coming to the Dominican Republic, they traveled three hours to join us with hope in their hearts.

At first Carlos doubted that the right chair could be found to fit Carlito's specific needs. The chair would need to tilt in space to accommodate Carlito's scoliosis and rounded upper back. Our seating therapists found a wheelchair that seemed promising for Carlito, but realized several modifications would be necessary to achieve the right fit.

Our volunteer mechanics rose to the challenge and began cutting, bending, attaching, and fitting various critical

parts together to ensure a safe and comfortable fit for Carlito. Carlos was amazed and said, "I have never seen a wheelchair like that!"

Carlito's wheelchair is one of a kind, just like him. And more than the wheelchair, as Carlos says, his family's experience with Joni and Friends provided fresh new hope and deepened their faith. Before taking his family home, Carlos shared a word God put on his heart for others: "Don't doubt that God loves you."


Stepping out in faith, Adam and Ashley adopted their son Robbie through the foster care system. Living with autism and carrying the weight of early childhood trauma, Robbie is non-verbal and struggles with sensory processing and emotional regulation.

At first their family found solace and connection in their church community. But when Robbie grew too old for the children's ministry, they heard what no parent should be told about their beloved child: "We don't have a place for him here."

Heartbroken and isolated, Adam, Ashley, and

Robbie found a place of belonging—first at our Splash Day event co-hosted by Fellowship Church, and then at Family Retreat.

"Family Retreat is a haven where we receive biblical encouragement, fellowship, and opportunities to connect with other parents experiencing similar hardships. It is a place where friends become family—a place of rest and respite. I never want to leave when it's time to go home, Family Retreat is the best week of our year!" says Ashley.

JONI'S 2026 PLANNER IS HERE!


