Being a quadriplegic makes me feel exposed and vulnerable. It requires taking risky steps of faith every day. But I know I can trust God with my life. Deuteronomy 33, verse 27 says that God is my refuge, and underneath are His everlasting arms. He cannot drop me. He will take care of me. He will never fail me. And it is this happy confidence in God and His everlasting arms that makes me want to be like Him... generous, open-handed, and bighearted!

So, I'm happy to give whatever I can to Christ's kingdom-work. It fills me with joy. And when I give generously in light of my own financial needs, I hold onto Luke 6, verse 38. "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." If I give selflessly, God promises to bless me with more joy and satisfaction. His everlasting arms will catch me, so seek first His kingdom and righteousness, Jesus says in Matthew 6:33, and all these things—all the medical supplies, food and clothing, caregiving costs and insurance premiums—all these things will be added to me in time.

With such reassuring words from Jesus, I'm not going to worry about spending too much time or giving too much, because <u>all of it</u> (time, treasure, talent)... these are <u>all gifts</u> from God. We are people of John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he *gave*..." It is God's character to give and give generously. We see this in Romans 8:32, "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?"

Now, if God had only given us his Son, Jesus, that would've been more than enough. But along with Jesus, God graciously gives us family and friends, sun and rain, and moon and stars, a home in heaven and a grand mission on earth—to generously give the Gospel that saves. Look, I am without a doubt, the most blessed quadriplegic in the world. I'm sitting up in a wheelchair while millions of disabled people worldwide wish they had one. I have a husband who stands by me (in developing nations, most women who become disabled are abandoned). I have a fulfilling job (sadly, most people like me will never land a job). And I'm blessed because I know Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior while most of the world's 1.3 billion people with disabilities have yet to hear His Name.



God has filled my life with Christ's light as I share His love with others. And, friend, He will do the same for you!

And so, I am more than willing to sacrifice my time and my treasure on behalf of people with disabilities—those who would give anything to have a caregiver, disabled people who have never heard the Gospel, and children with disabilities who crawl in the dirt for lack of a wheelchair. It's why I'm always asking my friends—friends like you—to join me in this glorious Gospel-cause. Be generous for the sake of the disabled, but more so... for *your* sake. I'm asking you to join me for *your benefit*. Because from God's point of view, generosity profits the giver more than the recipient.

When you give to Christ and His work, you are expressing your love for Him and it unites your heart to Him. *It changes you*. Our human nature is to be selfish, tightfisted, and fearful to give away anything we might need—but an unselfish giver has the character of Christ.

That's why I refuse to be tightfisted, selfish, and fearful about the future. I will trust in God's everlasting arms. Because generosity always results in a roomy soul that overflows with joy. And the confidence that it is God who has graciously given you all things, including His Son.



Jesus Shines Light in the Darkness Through You

Then Ruth lies awake at night, she prays... "Lord, help me put a meal on the table so my children won't go to bed hungry. God, help me keep a roof over their heads."

Ruth has always turned to Jesus when shame, rejection, and hardship press in. At age thirteen Ruth had both of her legs amputated due to a genetic condition affecting her hands and legs.

But her determined spirit stayed strong. Ruth has always trusted God to see her through.

When her sons, Victor and Melvin, were born with the same disability as Ruth, new struggles emerged. But, as Ruth says, she is dedicated to raising her three children—including her daughter Diana, who does not have disabilities—in a loving Christian home.

Despite financial pressures, hectic days, and unsteady work opportunities, Ruth remains committed to Jesus and to her children, drawing strength from God.

"Being in a family with disabilities has not been easy at all," says Ruth. "Sometimes I go without my diabetes medication so I can feed them. And I have gone into debt because I can't afford to pay the rent. But I trust God. He gives me the strength to keep on going. I know He will not forsake us."


Parenting has demanded deep sacrifices for Ruth. Melvin's disabilities prevent him from attending their local school, so Ruth has had to pay for private school tuition and transportation. To afford this, she used a broken-down wheelchair for years, saving the money she could have used for a newer wheelchair to send her children to school.



For Ruth, receiving a new, properly fitted wheelchair from Joni and Friends means that life Ruth overflows with joy and thanksgiving for the will improve greatly—for her and her children. But even more than renewed dignity, easier

"As a parent, you come to a point where you sacrifice yourself for your children," Ruth says. "And being disabled with my kids has been the toughest moment in my life."







When we first met Melvin, he didn't smile much—that is, until one of our team members brought out balls to play with. Noting how his face changed, one of our physical therapists asked Melvin if he liked sports. He quickly answered, "Yes!" Melvin loves volleyball, basketball, soccer, and karate.

We custom-fit Melvin with a specialized sports wheelchair. And when we showed him a video of paralympic volleyball, Melvin's eyes danced with delight—his whole face shining brightly. At nine years old, Melvin has the energy and coordination of an athlete. He moves with skill, as if he'd always had a special sports wheelchair.

Talking about Melvin, Ruth swells with pride.

"He's a good boy," Ruth says proudly.
"Personally, he is supportive to me. When we are left at home alone, Melvin helps me. He brings me things and will come to my room and say, 'Mama, are you okay?' 'Mama, do you need something?' 'Why are you so quiet?' He's a jovial, happy kid. I am grateful to God that now Melvin has a good wheelchair that he can do sports with. I really love to see him happy."

Thank you for shining the light of Christ into places of darkness and pain—all for the glory of the Savior we celebrate!




